# What can't I put in a Front Load trash dumpster?

Generally speaking, you cannot put any type of hazardous materials in your trash dumpster, including wet paint, oil (other auto liquids), asbestos, sealed tanks/drums, electronics (e-waste), tires and some types of furniture. You'll find a more detailed list below.



**Electronics & Appliances** - Televisions, Refrigerators, Computers, AC units, Microwaves, Washers/Dryers—a majority of general household appliances are not allowed to be thrown in the dumpster.

**Paint, Stains, and Lacquers** - You cannot throw paint, paint thinners, lacquers, or wood stains in a dumpster. If you have leftover latex paint that can't be reused or recycled, allow the paint to solidify by pouring it into a box with kitty litter or shredded paper. Once it's hard and dry, toss it in the dumpster.



**Hazardous Waste** - (Flammable Liquids/Chemicals, Poisons & Asbestos) - Asbestos, pesticides, propane tanks, household cleaners, ink and resins, contaminated soil or absorbents, and medical waste should never be put in a dumpster.

**Tires** - Because landfills do not accept tires, you cannot put tires in a dumpster.



**Batteries** - Car batteries and dry-cell batteries cannot be put in a dumpster because they can leak chemicals that harm the environment.

**Auto Fluids** - Motor Oil, Coolant, Transmission Fluid, Anti-Freeze, Lubricating Oil, Hydraulic Oil or any other automotive fluids are not allowed to be put in the dumpsters.



**Construction Debris** - Brick, Stone, Concrete, Asphalt, Roofing Shingles and Renovation Debris cannot be thrown in the dumpster.

**Furniture** - Couches, tables, chairs, mattresses—almost all types of bulky furniture are not accepted in the dumpsters.



*\*\*due to its size and weight, you will be required the use an Open Top/Roll Off dumpster which is designated for these types of materials. With heavy oversized debris, dumpster weight/size limits are especially important. If you go over the amount included in your quoted price, you will have to remove the overage or pay the overage fees. \*\**
